

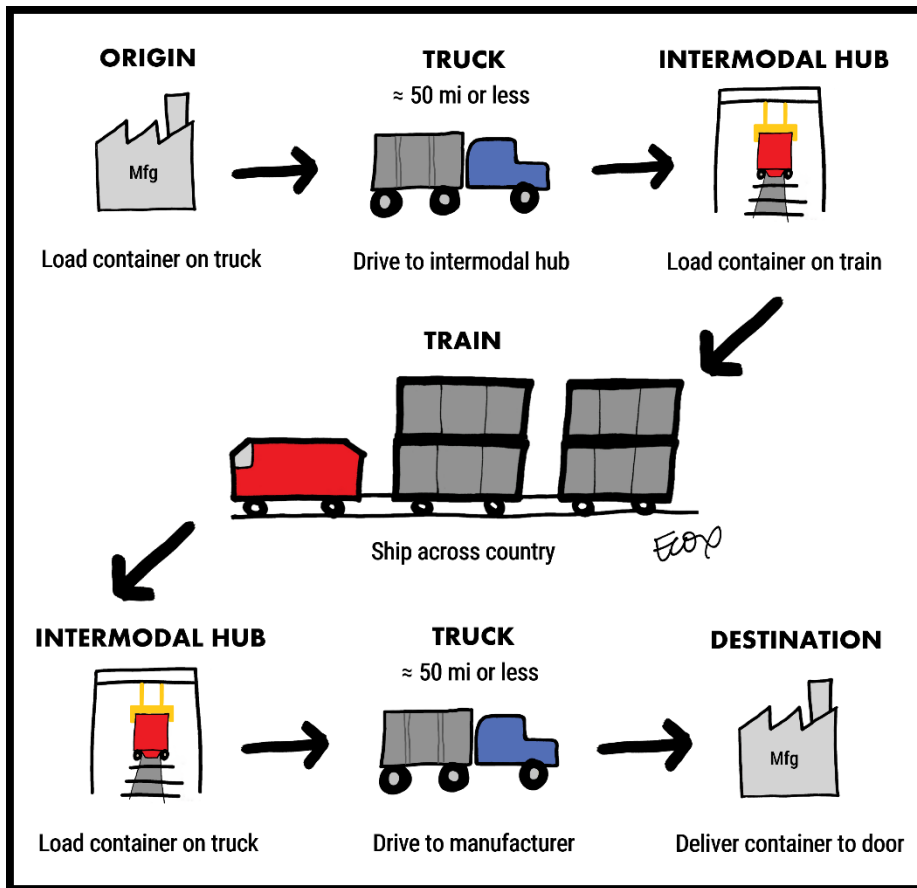

Typically, trucks carry shipping containers on both the first and last legs of the journey. Trains handle the business in-between, hauling them cross-country.

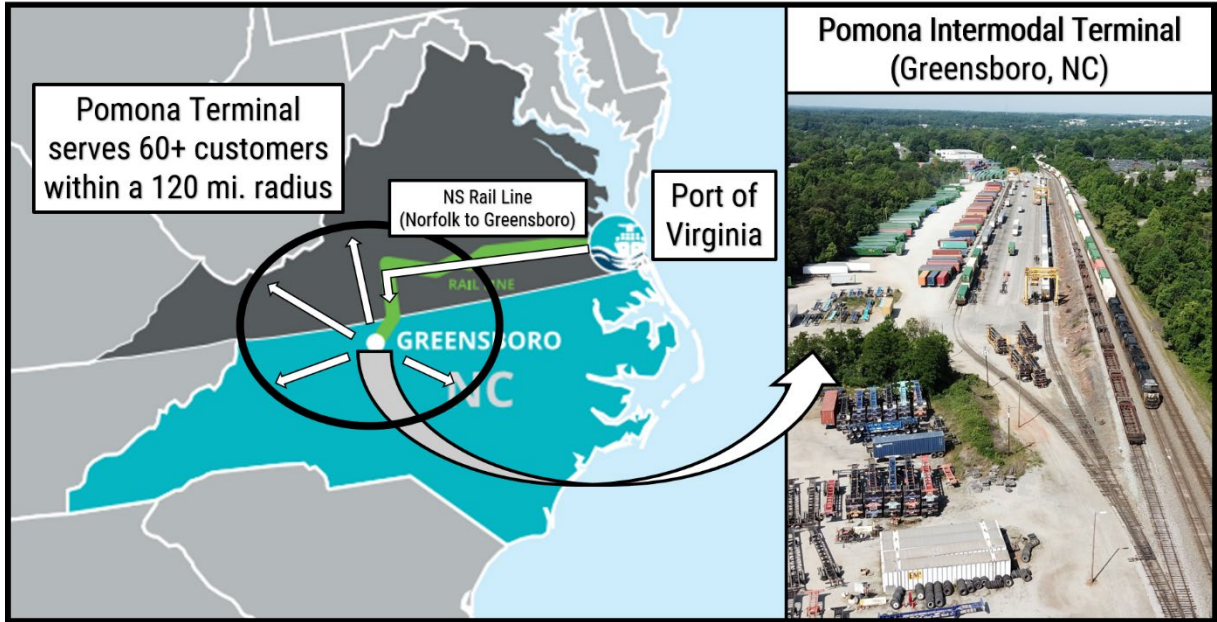
### Rail Intermodal Illustrated

Cargo Ship ➡ Port of Virginia ➡ Rail ➡ Pomona Terminal ➡ Truck ➡ Customers

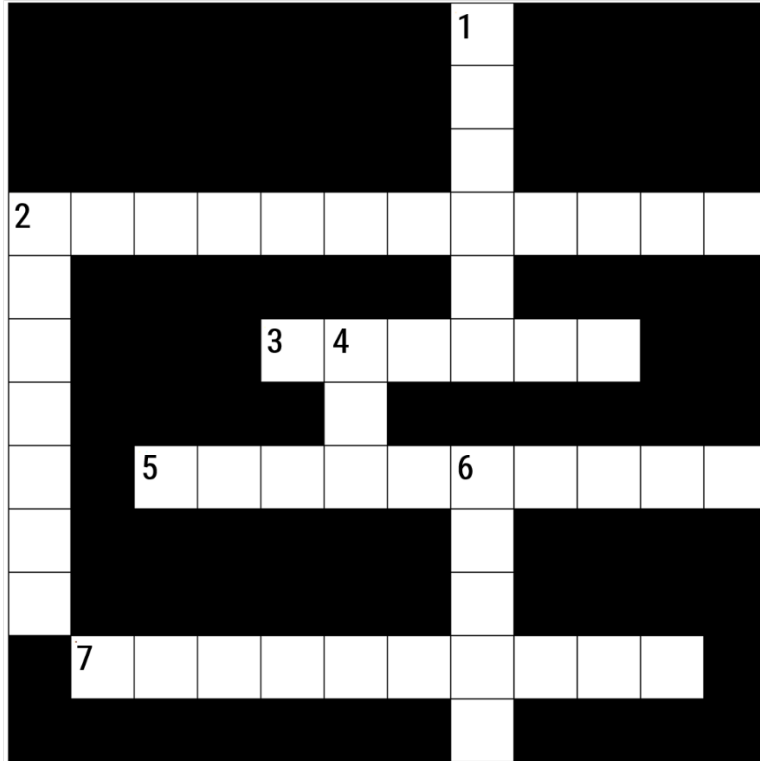
